Three new contracts for international conferences have recently been won by AIM Group International, taking the Italian professional conference organiser (PCO) deeper and further into the medical and other sectors.

Collaborating with the World Bank Group, the AIM Group will be organising the IFC's Global Debt Mobilisation Conference in Madrid this year, while the European Ceramic Society Congress, with an estimated participation of 1,500 delegates, will be held in Turin in June 2019.

The massive International Bar Association Conference, with its estimated 4,000 attendees, will be gracing Rome's new conference centre La Nuvola in December next year and the AIM Group will be supporting IBA's core PCO Judy Lane, ICS, with the management of the social programme as well as the local services.

The broadly-spread PCO, with offices around the world, will be making a triumphant return to Africa in October 2017. Following its successful handling of the 2016 edition in USA, the Group has been appointed to manage the African meeting of the Reproductive Health Supply Coalition in 2017 in Dakar, Senegal.

Also in the medical field, another important assignment will be with the ADI Congress (Alzheimer's Disease International) to be held in Milan in 2019 with the participation of 1,500 delegates.
